

The heroes, Hugh 'Bullshot' Crummond and Rosemary Fenton, the professor's daughter, set out to thwart their evil intentions. So begins a fast-paced comic romp that lurches from bizarre to the outrageous. Perfect theatre to fit the festive season

It is completely silly – and lots of fun; an ideal way for the Globe to end its year 'in exile'.

The Importance of Being Earnest is generally considered to be one of Wilde's most popular works, clever and witty – "one of the freshest comedies of the year" - according to a critic at the time of its first staging, and has been a staple of both professional and amateur theatre for more than 100 years. It has not been seen at the Globe since the 1990s so we are delighted to have the opportunity to celebrate the new year (in our own theatre) with this perennial favourite.

Nothing to be prepared: those auditioning will be given copies of the scripts to read.

This is a new venture for the Globe but is one that has worked very successfully in other centres where the engagement of young actors with even younger audience members has ensured sell-out houses for most performances. The stories are familiar and are – apparently – chosen at random by the young audience members themselves who then participate loudly and enthusiastically with the onstage action.

CONSERVATION REPAIR PROGRES

This has appeared to move more slowly this month as work has been done behind the scenes (excuse the pun) to facilitate the consent required for stage 3, the improvement of disabilities facilities and access. As we noted in last month's newsletter, we now plan to repair the original toilet block and increase the number of toilets available to audience and workers.

The completion date for the overall project has thus been extended but our builders and project manager are confident that all will be ready in time for the ToyBox production that will start on January $23^{\rm rd}$.

HELP NEEDED

Meanwhile, we can make a start on much of the clean-up, painting and general refurbishment of the interior (while rehearsals are underway for both *ToyBox* and *The Importance of Being Earnest)*. Committee members will of course be heavily involved with all of this but we hope that many of our members will also want to help. Thank you to those who have already volunteered but we will probably need some more to help with:

- cleaning, tidying and painting some of the interior, and
- (especially in January) tidying and replanting the garden

We will also need ongoing help with the wardrobe, a manager, if possible, but also various people to help sew and/or repair garments as needed, under the guidance of the manager. We have scheduled 3 productions (details to be released in December) that will require quite elaborate costuming.

Although we have a very extensive wardrobe at present, many of the garments are old and, yes, a little bit tatty. We hope to remove, donate and/or sell the pieces we no longer want or need so that what remains will all be potentially wearable. We will always need to make, alter or even purchase a few more, however, so skilled assistance with this will be much appreciated.
